**From the Desk of  
 Father Andrés**



My dear friends, is your life a series of events, or an adventure?

For the Apostles, life with Jesus was always an adventure. They never knew what was coming next: a blind man seeing, a hemorrhaging woman healed, a leper cleansed, a little girl raised from the dead, a crowd fed from a few loaves, Jesus walking on the lake to meet them, people converted and changed, the religious leaders hostile and angry. They never knew what to expect, so they must have come to live in a state of adventure - always expecting the unexpected.

Nowhere can we see this more clearly than at the celebration of the Seder meal at the Last Supper, and in the events that followed. At the meal, Jesus washes feet as only a slave would, gives his flesh and blood as nourishment, announces that he is leaving, and then delivers final instructions. As we know, this is followed swiftly with his arrest, torture and death, only to be followed quickly again by his resurrection, appearances, and his leaving once again to ascend into heaven. And then, just as things looked like they might return to “normal” for the disciples, along comes the Holy Spirit at Pentecost to surprise them again. And that was only the beginning. The Acts of the Apostles shows us that the disciples’ lives after Pentecost were just as much of an adventure, if not more so, than when Jesus walked with them.

As God’s children, commissioned by him as apostles, we are all adventurers. Our lives are not simply a series of events. Our lives are adventures, played out with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, who blows where and when he wills. We must come to expect the unexpected.

We are Easter people with nourishment, instruction, dying and rising waiting unexpectedly at every turn. We are Pentecost people, bearers of the Spirit of God, living our own daily adventure with him as our guide. Let us not dwell in the moment of our baptism in the Spirit, but rather let us enjoy the adventure as that baptism is renewed every day in the unexpected, Spirit-filled moments of our lives.

Rejoice and be glad in the adventure of your own journey as you safari to your final destination. Then you can begin to experience the words of St. Catherine of Siena who said, “All the way to heaven is heaven.”

I love you, God bless you, and may you fully live and enjoy your adventure.

## **Companion on the Journey**

**We can name the “7 gifts” of the Holy Spirit, but how exactly do they work? How do they operate in real life? In my life?**

**Since I head the RCIA program at our parish, a woman came to me about becoming Catholic. She had been Christian most of her life, but had moved from church to church, denomination to denomination. Still nomadic, she was drawn somehow to the Catholic faith.**

**She began pouring out her lengthy personal history. I wasn’t sure where her story was leading. Then the Spirit told me, “Interrupt her.” I didn’t want to obey because I didn’t know what to say. The Spirit persisted so I finally said, “OK. OK.” I asked her if I could interrupt. She said, “Yes,” and stopped. I turned silently to the Spirit and said, “OK. Now what?” The Spirit said, “Ask her if she believes there is an objective truth of the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.” I asked her. She thought for a moment: “That’s a good question.”**

**She then told me how she received communion at various Christian churches with the belief that it was the real presence of Jesus, but based only on her personal belief that it was the real presence. The Spirit’s question challenged her belief and opened a new inquiry in her mind about whether there is a really true presence in the Eucharist, outside of her own belief. And, where might she find such an objective real presence? She changed. Her perspective changed. Our dialogue changed.**

**I had no idea about any of that until the Spirit intervened. The Spirit was clearly at work, but what gift of the Spirit was at work? Knowledge? Wisdom? Counsel? All of those, plus some. It is rarely a matter of a single gift at work in any situation. It is always simply the total working of the Holy Spirit, who embodies all gifts.**

**The mission of the Holy Spirit is to sanctify each of us: individually and collectively in the Church. When the Spirit draws us toward God and away from gossip or lying or ..., and draws us into truly loving others, and enables us to act in those holier, more loving ways, that is the gift of sanctifying grace at work. When the Spirit actively intervenes and prompts us to act in ways that work for the sanctification of oneself or of others, and gives us the abilities to carry out those promptings, that is the gift of actual grace. Most importantly, it is the Spirit who is at work. In our story, the Spirit worked in me, in the woman, and through us to each other.**

**Let’s pray: “Holy Spirit, my companion, I surrender myself to you so that you may sanctify me and work through me for the sanctification of others. Amen.”**

**Listen for God’s Spirit today. He is your companion on the journey.**

## 19th Annual Catholic Charis- matic Conference In February A Great Success



An enthusiastic crowd of 400 people gathered at the Phoenix Convention Center on February 25th and 26th, 2011 for the Catholic Charismatic Renewal's annual conference. Guest speakers were Father Bill Halbing, Brother Ale Aguspina, and Moira Noonan.

The theme for the conference was, "I Am The Lord" (Isaiah 42:8). There were break out sessions for the youth and young people who attended and our speakers took turns speaking to them as well.

The opening night mass was celebrated by our Auxiliary Bishop Eduardo Nevares who reminded us that the word of God is alive and effective in our lives today, and that it is not "one Lord today and another Lord tomorrow", but the same God yesterday, today and tomorrow. We need to come to know Jesus beyond a shadow of a doubt, to be able to say, "I have come to know my Lord and my God" and "I love Him and others as He has loved me."

Father Bill Halbing told us that the Holy Spirit brings us up to God's standards. We need to be pure, broken, willing to be exposed in the midst of our enemies, and to go up higher in our desire to embrace God. He said that the largest number of people coming into the Catholic Church come in through the Charismatic Renewal!

He told us about the signs of the second coming, that the great apostasy has begun. We are in the end times. We are also in for the greatest outpouring of the Holy Spirit yet to come. The Pope has said that the charismatic groups are keeping the Catholic church alive. God will be shaking out of us everything that is not of God. We must arrive at a place where we can say, "God alone!". God is saying, "I will shake all the nations". God will never compromise the gospel. When the shaking stops we will be fully baptized in the Holy Spirit. What can't be shaken out will remain.

Brother Ale Aguspina told us that we have seen the light and we need to share this light with people who are still in darkness. Our greatest vocation is to see God and to be with him forever. Whatever we do, we must be holy.

God says, "I am the Lord, My glory I give to no one." Jesus Christ is Lord for the glory of God.

We tend to want to honor ourselves and want glory for ourselves. There is a danger when we serve God of wanting glory for what we do. God cannot tolerate competition. We must not let anything compete with God. Whatever we let compete with God is an idol.

Moira Noonan warned us about the New Age beliefs and occult practices that are creeping into the Catholic Church. She shared with us her testimony of having been led into these beliefs and practices and of her conversion out of them. There is a battle going on for our souls and we have to know who the enemy is and resist. Many of these wrong teachings are being taught now in the Catholic Church. It is part of the movement toward a one world religion of self rather than of reliance on God. The unholy trinity of the New Age is, "me, myself, and I", not the Holy Trinity.

The Saturday night healing Mass of the Conference was celebrated by Father John Shetler and concelebrated by Father Dan McBride.

In Father Shetler's homily he reminded us that we are like little children in the arms of God, and, like a good parent, God will provide for us and take care of us.

Bearing fruit is everything we do. It is a painful delivery process as we increase in the knowledge of God, turn away from sin, and spend time in worshipping God.



We are to get filled with the knowledge of God's Will, filled with the Holy Spirit, get understanding, and lead a life worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to Jesus.

"The older you get the stronger you should be," he said. "Do not give up or become discouraged. Your Best days are still ahead!"

## CRM Supports Parish RCIA Retreat

CRM's vision is "a radiant church through the Holy Spirit," via CRM's mission to "put the gifts of the Spirit into service

to the community" and to "give testimony to what the love of God has done in our lives." CRM put this vision and mission into practice at St. Jerome parish.

On Saturday, March 5, the St. Jerome RCIA and RICA (Spanish RCIA) groups came together for a bilingual Lenten retreat around the theme of "He must increase and I must decrease." CRM was invited to participate, and responded with overwhelming support. The results, too, were overwhelming, and beautiful.

CRM provided a bilingual speaker, Bertha Murillo, and six bilingual prayer teams (twelve people from around the Valley). Bertha not only spoke but also assisted with the translations from English to Spanish, and vice versa.

What exactly did CRM do to help? They mobilized a small army from areas, and parishes, far from St. Jerome. This was a real witness to the 150+ retreat attendees. When the prayer teams



arrived, they immediately went into prayer for an extended period of time – another witness. Bertha shared her testimony, called people to a deeper personal relationship with Jesus, and led people in a "sinner's prayer" and a prayer to receive the Holy Spirit in power. The prayer teams prayed with each of the participants - candidates, catechumens, sponsors and team alike - and then finished with another extended time of group prayer among themselves; all-in-all, a tremendous witness of faith and love from start to finish.

People on the retreat were touched and lives were changed. The Spirit moved and Jesus was proclaimed as Lord. The Church, Christ's Body on earth, became more radiant. Thank you, Jesus. Thank you, CRM. Thank you, Holy Spirit.
