OAK Description:

Put together inexpensive themed gift bags to give away to your neighbors. Themes can be new neighbor, get well, new baby, just married, etc. Include an evangelistic video like *The Passion for the Christ*.



OAK is a tool used for all discipleship groups and families to facilitate outreach activities in our community. Each discipleship group (Adult Bible Fellowship (ABFs), Transformational Accountability Groups (TAGs), On Going Accountability Groups (OAGs) and Covenant Groups, etc.) or family - should choose one suggested activity each quarter and perform the activity with their group. These activities are to be low cost, low risk projects. They should be easy to do and easy for your group to join in. Projects should be localized to fit your group (not a large church wide activity). These projects should not require outside funding or fundraising.



How to use your OAK:

1. Choose an OAK from Crossroads Outreach webpage:
www.crossroadscovenant.com/content/ministries/outreach/oak and select an activity or make up your own.
2. Serve with your discipleship group or family (this is a team sport).
3. Debrief right after your outreach activity by having a short eating experience (coffee, desert or full meal) and share about your experiences.
4. Leader of group should complete the feedback section below, then either return the completed card to the Crossroad Outreach Director or email your information to outreach.crossroads@gmail.com. Discipleship leaders are encouraged to share your group's experience at the next Ministry Community Meeting.
5. Finally, pick another OAK for your next quarter activity.
