Community Health Screening!

Life Line Screening will be at Cross Roads United Methodist Church on April 29 to offer affordable, non-invasive, painless health screenings. Five screenings will be offered to scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries, which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms, which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs, which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat, which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis. Individual screening \$45. Register for a Wellness Package with Heart Rhythm for \$149. All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete. Missions Announcements:

Thanks for your support of our mission work!

Missions Trips: The senior high trip will be on July 18-23 to the *Hinton Rural Life Center* in Hayesville, NC. The cost will be \$125 per person. The first deposit of \$50 will be due, along with an application for the trip, by **March 14th**. Our middle school trip is being planned for early August. We will go to the *Upshur Parish Mission House* in Buckhannon, WV for ministry there and in the community.

Mission Cans: It is time again to get out those *Change the World* cans for missions! Hopefully you still have your reusable can from last year. If not we have more! See if you can fill a can with change during the Lenten season.

Health Kits for Haiti: It is estimated that hundreds of thousands of health kits will be needed both immediately and in the coming months. To create a health kit, place the following **NEW** items in a sealed one-gallon plastic bag:

1 hand towel (15" x 25" up to 17" x 27". No kitchen towels.)
1 washcloth
1 comb (large and sturdy, not pocket-sized)
1 nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
1 bath-size bar of soap (3 oz. and up)
1 toothbrush (single brushes only in original wrapper, no child-size brushes)
6 adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages
\$1.00 to purchase toothpaste
(Toothpaste is purchased in bulk to be added to health kits to ensure that the product does not expire before they are sent.)

Because the emergency kits are carefully planned to make them usable in the greatest number of situations and strict rules govern product entry into international countries, UMCOR requires that the kits contain **only the requested items** – nothing more. Kits may be brought to the church, and we will ship them to distribution centers.
