Health Kits for Haiti: It is estimated that hundreds of thousands of health kits will be needed both immediately and in the coming months. To create a health kit, place the following **NEW** items in a sealed one-gallon plastic bag:

- 1 hand towel (15" x 25" up to 17" x 27". No kitchen towels.)
- 1 washcloth
- 1 comb (large and sturdy, not pocket-sized)
- 1 nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
- 1 bath-size bar of soap (3 oz. and up)
- 1 toothbrush (single brushes only in original wrapper, no child-size brushes)
- 6 adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages
- \$1.00 to purchase toothpaste (Toothpaste is purchased in bulk to be added to health kits to ensure that the product does not expire before they are sent.)

Because the emergency kits are carefully planned to make them usable in the greatest number of situations and strict rules govern product entry into international countries, UMCOR requires that the kits contain **only the requested items** – nothing more. Kits may be brought to the church, and we will ship them to distribution centers.

CONNECTIONS WITH HAITI

Today, at 3:00 P.M. at Milton UMC, Pastor Lynn Cartwright will present a short program about past mission trips to Haiti and will discuss ways of helping St. Joseph's Home for Boys, Wings of Hope, and Trinity House where she has worked.
