**RULES FOR DEBATE
EASTERN OKLAHOMA PRESBYTERY
JUNE 2008**

A-4

PURPOSE:

When we gather as a presbytery, we seek the mind of Christ and God's will for us here and now. During this process of discernment, we commit ourselves to work together for the good of the Presbytery as we talk together with forbearance and pray for one another as members of the Body of Christ.

GENERAL RULES AND PRINCIPLES:

The rules which govern conduct and process at meetings of Eastern Oklahoma Presbytery are contained in the Book of Order and Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised. A chart of motions is attached to the Stated Clerk's Report. However, to assist the Presbytery in its work together, the following summary of rules and procedures is offered.

AGENDA:

Our agenda, or order of business, is provided online or by mail prior to Stated Meetings. It is adopted at the beginning of the meeting with any appropriate changes noted. It is not binding unless an item is noted as an "order of the day."

ORDER OF THE DAY:

A particular item of business may be set in advance to be taken up during a given session at a specific time. It cannot be taken up prior to the time for which it is set except by reconsidering the vote that established the order (a motion which can only be made by a person that voted for the adoption of the docket with the previously identified "order of the day"). A majority vote is required for passage.

ADDRESSING THE ASSEMBLY:

1. Speakers who wish to be heard should stand until recognized by the moderator.
2. Speakers should use a microphone, that all may hear.
3. Speakers should address all comments to the moderator and should be respectful at all times.
4. Speakers should preface all remarks by identifying themselves by name, status (minister, elder commissioner, member of Council, certified educator or administrative personnel who is an elder, commissioned lay pastor, if so authorized), and (where appropriate) congregation. Guests may not speak, unless offered the privilege of the floor by a vote of the presbytery.
5. The moderator has the prerogative of not recognizing speakers and motions which are out of order. Appeals of the moderator's rulings may be made by moving to a microphone and raising a "point of order."
6. The Stated Clerk is the parliamentarian of the meeting. Appeals of the moderator's rulings should be directed to the moderator, who will seek the advice of the parliamentarian. The moderator may consult with the Stated Clerk as needed during the meeting.

MOTIONS:

1. Motions coming from a committee (or commission or task force) do not need a second (having been seconded, in effect, by the rest of the committee). New motions offered on

the floor of the meeting require a second. Motions which do not receive a second (from committee or the floor) automatically fail.

2. Once a motion has been made, seconded, and restated by the moderator, the floor will be open for debate on that motion.
3. A motion that is not included in packet material should be provided in writing to the stated clerk before being stated on the floor.
4. Only minister members of the presbytery, elder commissioners, and other persons designated by the presbytery as a matter of rule may vote on motions before the body. There may be occasions on which means of verification will be issued to identify persons eligible to vote.
5. From time to time, commissioners may feel the need to register dissent or protest. Each is appropriate at any time. A dissent registers a person's disagreement with an action taken and may be delivered to the Stated Clerk in writing – it should include the person's name, commissioner status and congregation, and the action for which the dissent is registered. A protest, alleging improper action, may also be filed in writing with the Stated Clerk – indicating name, commissioner status, congregation, and alleged irregularity and delinquency. Either action must be filed before adjournment.

DEBATE:

1. The maker of the motion has the right to be the first speaker to the motion, but not also the last (this is a change in Roberts Rules).
2. Speakers must first identify the nature of their comments: whether they are speaking for or against the motion, asking a question, or making a new motion.
3. Each speaker will be allowed two (2) minutes.
4. Speakers will alternate between those for the motion and those against the motion.
5. Speakers may only speak one time on any motion as long as anyone who has not spoken desires the floor. Speaking twice on a motion exhausts any further right of that speaker to debate that question.
6. Debate will not continue when there are no opposing speakers. The moderator may declare debate closed if there is nothing new to add.
7. At various times in the meeting, it may be appropriate for a commissioner or the moderator to request a time of silence, prayer, or praise.

QUESTIONS:

Questions for clarification will take precedence over debate and will be answered as they arise before debate continues.

CALL FOR THE QUESTION:

Occasionally a commissioner feels the debate is no longer fruitful and wishes to close debate. The motion to “call for the question” or “move the previous question,” when recognized by the moderator and seconded, calls for an end to the debate and must be considered before any further discussion on the current debate. Any request to end debate must be made from a microphone. The moderator does not have to recognize a motion to close debate. A two thirds (2/3) vote is required for passage of this motion. If such a motion passes, the moderator will state the motion on the floor and call for the vote. At the discretion of the moderator, he or she may simply ask, “Are you ready to vote?” If there is no objection, the moderator may rule, “Then we shall proceed to vote on the main motion (or amendment).”

4. The motion passed to offer three “Gatherings” to pastors in order to discuss the passage of Amendment 10-A from 10:00 to 1:00 with lunch provided.
5. The motion passes to ask Eveline Steele to make a basket for the Presbytery to present to Judy Fletcher in honor of her retirement as Executive of the Synod of the Sun.
6. The motion passed to allow the Moderator of the Developing Congregations and Evangelism Committee to sign grant requests.
7. Plans were completed for the June 10-11, 2010, Tri-Presbytery Meeting.

DESCRIPTION OF COMMITTEES & AGENCIES **E-4**
OF EASTERN OKLAHOMA PRESBYTERY
JUNE 2010

Presbytery Assembly:

- The presbytery is the governing body, responsible for mission, program, oversight and policy for the congregations in Eastern Oklahoma
- Meets quarterly (typically in March, June, September, December)

Presbytery Council:

- Comprised of moderators of standing committees and three persons elected at large
- Serves as the coordinating council for the presbytery
- At-large members serve as the presbytery meeting planning team
- Meets quarterly, about four weeks prior to each presbytery meeting

Care of Church Professionals Committee:

- Responsible for pastoral care and support of pastors and church professionals
- Meets quarterly, on Committee Days

Connecting Congregations Committee:

- Responsible for ministries linking congregations to the presbytery, the Presbyterian Church (USA), and the world
- Meets quarterly, on Committee Days

Developing Congregations Committee:

- Responsible for ministries and strategies in support of congregational development and vitality in the presbytery and its congregations
- Meets quarterly, on Committee Days

Finance & Administration Committee:

- Oversees the presbytery budget and investments, including its monthly expenses
- Meets quarterly, on Committee Days

Ministry Committee:

- Oversees and provides models for pastoral leadership within the presbytery
- Meets 9-12 times per year (not on Committee Days)

Mission Committee:

- Responsible for developing and implementing a mission strategy for the presbytery, interpreting and promoting presbytery mission causes, and assisting congregations in mission
- Meets quarterly, on Committee Days (subcommittees meet as needed)
- Subcommittees: Malawi Partnership; Social Concerns

Nominating Committee:

- Provides nominees for presbytery officers, committees, and moderators of committees, as well as Dwight Agency, Synod and General Assembly
- Meets quarterly, on Committee Days

Permanent Judicial Commission:

- Serves as ecclesiastical court for matters referred in accord with *Rules of Discipline*
- Meets as needed

Personnel Committee:

- Oversees presbytery staff and develops/applies personnel policies
- Meets quarterly, on Committee Days

Preparation for Ministry Committee:

- Oversees inquirers and candidates for ministry
- Meets 6-8 times per year, including Committee Days

Representation Committee:

- Encourages full participation by all constituent groups in the life and work of the presbytery
- Meets quarterly, on Committee Days

Resourcing Congregations Committee:

- Responsible for ministries and resources in support of congregations and their programs
- Meets quarterly, on Committee Days
- Subcommittees: Youth Council

Trustees:

- Oversees the real property of the presbytery and serves as liaison between the presbytery and its congregations in matters of their real property
- Meets quarterly, on Committee Days

Dwight Mission Agency Board:

- Oversees program and facilities of Dwight Mission Camp & Conference Center
- Meets 4-6 times per year, not on Committee Days (meetings rotate between all 3 presbyteries)

Dwight Mission, Inc:

- Oversees investments and real properties of Dwight Mission
- Meets at least annually, not on Committee Days

Commissioner and Young Adult Advisory Delegate to General Assembly:

- Serves as commissioner to week-long General Assembly (usually in June or July)
- Elected for two-year terms (elected in Sept or Dec of odd years for even-year Assembly meeting)
- Must be able to attend orientation prior to GA and report to presbytery after return (June or Sept)
- Lay persons must also submit a letter of recommendation from Session
- Young Adult Advisory Delegate must be 18-23 years old on the day General Assembly convenes

Commissioner to Synod:

- Serves as commissioner to Synod meetings (typically three 2-day meetings per year)
- Elected to two-year terms (new class elected each year)

COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY REPORT
JUNE 10, 2011

The following items from the April and May committee meetings are for presbytery action:

Concerning a Policy for New Minister Transitions

The committee recommends that Eastern Oklahoma Presbyter approve the attached Policy on Transition Retreat for New Pastors and require a one-day retreat within the first 3-6 months of each new call.

Concerning 2011 Terms of Call

The committee recommends the Eastern Oklahoma Presbytery approve the attached report on pastors' terms of call for 2011.

Concerning Fran Callaway

The committee recommends that Eastern Oklahoma Presbytery grant permission to labor outside our bounds in order to serve as pastoral relief for the Rev John Wilson at First Presbyterian Church in Independence, KS (in the Presbytery of Southern Kansas), while Rev Wilson is on sabbatical. Rev Callaway will serve June 5-August 28, 2011.

Concerning Tulsa, First / Warren Muller

The committee concurred with the request of the Session and the action of the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Tulsa to accept the resignation (and retirement) of Warren Muller as Parish Associate, effective July 31, 2011. The committee recommends that Eastern Oklahoma Presbytery bestow upon Warren Muller the status of Honorably Retired..

Concerning Tulsa, First / Ryan Moore

Pending congregational action, the committee recommends that Eastern Oklahoma Presbytery concur in the request of the congregation and the associate pastor to dissolve the pastoral relationship between , effective August 31, 2011. At this point Ryan will remain on our rolls as a member at large while he enters into a PhD program.

Concerning Poteau, First / Jan Dittmar

Pending congregational action on June 5, the committee recommends that Eastern Oklahoma Presbytery concur with the request of the Pastor and the congregation to dissolve the pastoral relationship, effective May 31, 2011, with continuation of salary, housing, social security offset for up to five months (through October 31, 2011) and continuation of pension/medical benefits for up to nine months (through February 28, 2012). Continuation of compensation and benefits will be discontinued if other employment with benefits is obtained prior to the end of the approved extensions.

Concerning Judy Fletcher

Upon her retirement as the Synod Executive for Synod of the Sun on July 31, 2011, the committee recommends that Eastern Oklahoma Presbytery bestow upon Judy Fletcher the status of honorably retired.

The following actions were taken by the Committee on Ministry at its April and May committee meetings and will be included in the presbytery minutes:

Concerning Wagoner, First and Leigh McCaslin

The committee approved a half-time Stated Supply contract between the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Wagoner and Leigh McCaslin, effective May 1 - December 31, 2011, with the following terms:
