People of Faith,

Do you remember the old television show *Cheers*? For those of a different generation, *Cheers* was a comedy based in a Boston bar where characters ranging from the country bumpkin Woody to the former big league pitcher Sam gathered for conversation and fellowship. One of my favorite episodes is when Doctor Fraiser Krane decides the people of the bar need a little culture so he brings in a copy of the Charles Dickens’ classic *A Tale of Two Cities*. The story begins with those famous lines:

It was the best of times, it was the worst of times.

Immediately, Norm interrupts the good doctor asking, “So which was it? Was it the best of times or the worst of times?” Fraiser responds, “It was both! It was the best of times AND the worst of times!” To which Cliff Clavin, everyone’s favorite postman replies, “This Dickens guy really likes to cover his butt.” Fans of *Cheers* may recall how in order to hold the patrons’ attention Doctor Krane had to take certain liberties with the plot including humorous details of teenage mutant turtles jumping out of a Blackhawk helicopter. Fans of Martin Luther however, might hear something vaguely familiar in those seemingly conflicted words. In the classic *Freedom of a Christian*, the Great Reformer wrote:

*A Christian is a perfectly free Lord of all, subject to none.
A Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant of all, subject to all.*

One cannot help but initially wonder if our beloved Norm and Cliff had heard these words read aloud, if they would not have questioned Martin’s wisdom. It does seem odd. After all, how can a Christ be a “free Lord of all” and a “dutiful servant of all” at the same time? Cliff might have asked, “Which is it? Are we free or are we servants?”

The answer found in the heart of Lutheranism is BOTH. What this means in everyday language is this: Through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, you have been set free from the powers of sin, hell, death, and the devil. To be clear, there is nothing you can or need to do in order to be free—it is a gift from God to you and it cannot be taken away in this life or the next. AND (there is always an AND in Lutheranism), the God who has set you free, the Savior who entered into death and hell for your sake, calls you to use your freedom to serve others, to become a servant of all those you encounter—not because you have to serve others but because you are following the example of Jesus Christ, you GET to serve others.

This Means We Are 100% Free AND We Are 100% SERVANTS.

Blessings to you this month as you live out your Christian Freedom serving those in need!

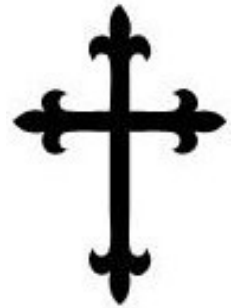

- **Secretary Report** – Approve minutes from Aug. 10th meeting – Motion to approve by Randy Langworthy and 2nd by Dave Graham. All approved.
- **Treasurer Report** – Approve August financial report – Review updated financial reports during a “Special Session” to be held on Monday, 9/21/09 @ 7pm. Denny called a “special session” on Monday, 9/21/09.

Committee Reports:

Health News

Preventing the Flu: Good Health Habits Can Help Stop Germs: The single best way to prevent seasonal flu is to get vaccinated each year, but good health habits like covering your cough and washing your hands often can help stop the spread of germs and prevent respiratory illnesses like the flu. There also are flu antiviral drugs that can be used to treat and prevent the flu.

- Avoid close contact. Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick too.
- Stay home when you are sick. If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. You will help prevent others from catching your illness.
- Cover your mouth and nose. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. It may prevent those around you from getting sick.
- Clean your hands. Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Practice other good health habits. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.

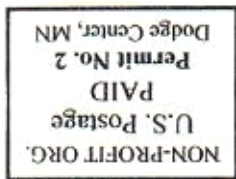
