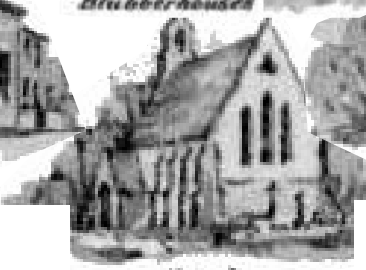

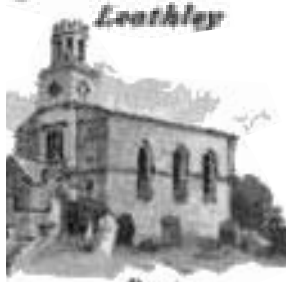

REFLECTIONS

We all know these are trying times financially, with more and more folk falling into more and more debt but we don't often think about how our Christian faith can help us through. So what advice does the Bible have for us?

"*Stupid people spend their money as fast as they get it,*" so says Proverbs 27: 20. But what is it that tempts us to live beyond our means? Why are we rarely satisfied with what we have? Here are three myths for you to think about and truths from Scripture to counter them:

Myth 1: "*Having more things will make me happier.*"

Fact: "*He who loves money will never have enough. The foolishness of thinking that wealth brings happiness. The more you have, the more you spend.*" (Eccl. 5: 10-11)

Myth 2: "*Having more things will make me more important.*"

Fact: "*Be on your guard against greed in any shape or form. For a man's real life in no way depends on his possessions.*" (Lk. 12: 15)

Myth 3: "*Having more things will make me more secure.*"

Fact: "*The rich man thinks of his wealth as an impregnable defence, a high wall of safety. What a dreamer!*" (Prov. 18: 11)

When we buy into these myths we will be tempted to live beyond our means. But there is an alternative way. We can learn to enjoy life more on less.

You can find happiness in helping others. Jesus said, "*There's more happiness in giving than receiving.*" (Acts 20: 35) Just look around you and you'll see this is true. The happiest people are those who help the most, not those who have the most.

You can find your self-worth by getting to know God. God says, "*You are precious in my sight!*" (Is. 43: 4) You matter to God. He made you for a purpose. Genuine self-esteem comes from establishing a relationship with God and becoming who he made you to be.

You can find your security in trusting God, not your bank balance. "*Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have because God has said, 'I will never leave you nor abandon you.'*" (Heb. 13: 5) Real security can only be found in something that can never be taken from you. While there are many ways to lose your possessions, Jesus has promised that God will take care of you, no matter what, if you trust him.

Please do come and join in.

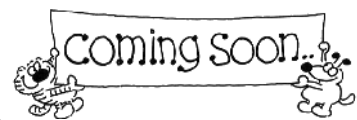

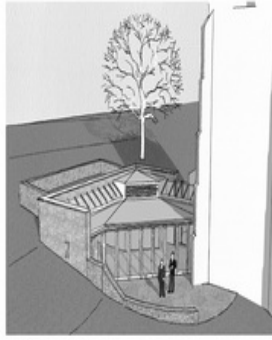
PCC meetings are held quarterly – let us have your ideas – they will be most welcome.

THE WASHBURN HERITAGE PROJECT

At the time of writing this, frustratingly, there is still little more to report on the building front. Negotiations with the building contractor who submitted the best tender for the building of the Heritage Centre have inevitably been on hold over the holiday period. However we are hoping to reach agreement and get approval of the contract from the Heritage Lottery Fund before the end of the month. This would lead to a start on site in the spring, with the building completed before the end of the year.



Meanwhile, work on the programme for the Centre continues, and some equipment for the exciting oral history project and for adult learning has been purchased using some of the LEADER grant. The series of classes to be run by our Washburn Valley WEA branch in February, March and April will offer the opportunity to learn some skills in traditional crafts. 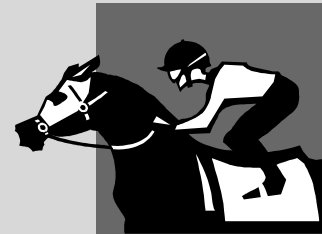

STILL THOUGHT-LESS ATHEISTS

The BBC Radio 4's "Thought for the Day" will remain closed to atheists and humanists, after the BBC Trust rejected accusations that the Radio 4 Today agenda-setting programme is in breach of editorial guidelines. The Regulator said it was a matter of discretion for the Director General and the BBC Executive to decide whether to keep the religious slot as it is, or to change it to include non-religious perspectives. The ruling followed complaints from lobby groups, who said the policy of only allowing speakers from mainstream faiths amounted to discrimination. Average daily audience is over 5 million.

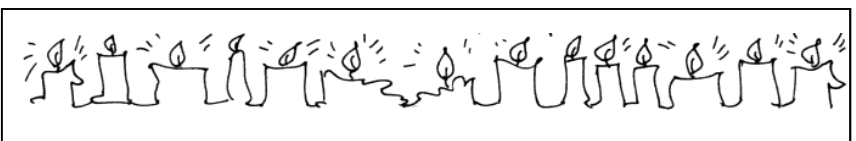

OTLEY BRASS BAND UPDATE

2009 saw Otley Brass Band start their year off to a full house at Fewston Church set in glistening snow. From this beautiful start the year progressed rapidly with many new challenges set out before the band.

March saw the start of the new Development Band (Wharfe Brass) which now has over 40 regular members, this group for both young and old has developed Otley Brass Band into one of the largest brass organisations in this area providing for members from 7 to 70+.

In May the band travelled to Saddleworth and Tameside to take part for the first time in the Whit Friday Marches, immortalised in the film 'Brassed Off'. Otley enjoyed the evening even though it was the wettest on record and marched through five villages over the course of the night, returning with more silverware to add to the cabinet.

A fast summer followed with many appearances, before returning to Hardraw Scar (Hawes) in September. Having won the lower section here for two consecutive years, a rule change forced the band to compete at a higher level. A fourth place here was well fought for, and we are keen to return next year with greater determination and focus.

November heralded an invitation to be part of 'A Passionate Women' by Kay Mellor and starring Billie Piper. This was filmed in Leeds and a brass band in fifties style uniform was needed. So with side partings and beehives and the rest, we dodged the rain to perform. This will be shown on BBC1 later this year.

December arrived, and with it one of the busiest times for the band, with over 10 engagements in 3 weeks, the carolling season was hard work.

Now, as the great wheel turns, the band is back at Fewston Church on February 7th for another concert, and, perhaps, the snow clad landscape shall again glisten in beautiful harmony to the music pouring forth.

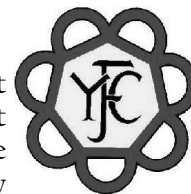

CHRISTIAN AID AWARDED MAJOR PRIZE

Christian Aid has become the largest development agency in the UK to be awarded the Humanitarian Accountability and Quality Management Standard (HAP) for its humanitarian, development and advocacy work in developing countries. The certification process saw the agency undergo audits in its British, Irish, Indian and Burkina Faso offices where policies, procedures, management processes and relationships with partner organisations and communities were scrutinised.

LENT

- A GOOD TIME TO PRAY

Lent is traditionally a time when Christians take stock of themselves spiritually. They set aside extra time for prayer. So there you are, tentatively wanting to pray... Here are some helpful things to remember as you settle down to it:

People have been praying since Adam had a grandson named Enosh. At least the Bible tells us in Genesis 4:26 that it was during his days when "men began to call on the name of the Lord". They have been doing it ever since.

People have been answered by God since Genesis, too. But if you want to read some beautiful prayers – and answers to them, browse through the Psalms. Again and again the psalmist writes: "the Lord heard my cry".

So – what do you need to bring to prayer? Just the tiniest amount of faith that God is even there.... Jesus assures us that even faith as big as a tiny mustard seed will be effective.

What gives you the right to come before Almighty God? Jesus does. The Bible is clear that "there is one mediator between God and men, the man Jesus Christ". (1 Tim 2:5)

The Bible makes clear that God does not stand on ceremony – he wants our personal, spontaneous prayers. Jesus was very matter of fact about it: "When you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you." (Matthew 6:6)

The Bible assures us that prayer will bring us good things: "we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need". (Hebrews 4:16)

Above all, prayer must be made with a pure heart. "If I had cherished sin in my heart, the Lord would not have listened." (Psalm 66:18) That simply means that if you know you are doing something wrong, and intend to keep right on doing it, don't waste your time praying.

Finally, what can be the results of your prayers this Lent? Well, here are seven, for starters....

1. Joy and deep happiness. (John 16:24)
2. Relief from your worry, stress and tension (Philippians 4:6,7)
3. Wisdom and more mental clarity (James 1:5,6)
4. Protection and deliverance from temptations (Matthew 26:41)
5. An ability to share the Good News of Jesus to other people (Matthew 9:38)
6. Strength to persevere when you feel under spiritual attack (Ephesians 6:18)
7. A growing thankfulness to God, who is worthy of all glory (Revelation 4:11)

Give Satan an inch and he'll be a ruler.
