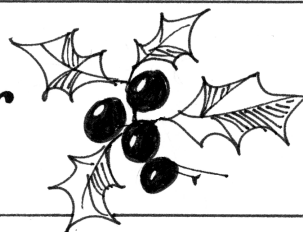

WHAT PART WILL YOU TAKE?

The nativity play has to be one of the highlights of Christmas. We've all heard funny stories like the inn keeper who invites Mary and Joseph in for a cup of tea or the baby Jesus who suddenly pipes up: "My name is Tammy, are you my Mommy?"

Here in the Washburn Valley we are getting ready for our very own Nursery Rhyme Nativity. It's rumoured that the baby Jesus has been cast and that one little boy has already bagged a shepherd costume.

But what about you? Who would you be in the nativity story? Imagine the scene, that you are there. Come and take your place in the stable.

Come as Mary or Joseph, the bearers of the child; the care-givers, the providers of food and shelter, the holders of boundaries; sometimes struggling but doing their best to get it right.

Come as a shepherd, a worker, practical and in touch with winter and summer, the wind, rain and sun; knowing the hard mysteries of birthing and dying, the toughness and realities of life; full of fear and joy.

Come as an angel, a herald of glory, full of wonder and vision, singing of peace and love.

Come as an ox or ass, speechless and humble and serving, written out of the story yet loved by the child.

Come as one of the Magi, travelling with mystery and enquiry, a stargazer and bringer of spiritual gifts.

Come as you, with your hopes and fears, with your gifts and needs, with your daily routine and your dreams. Come see the child in the manger. Hold him, talk to him, tell him whatever it is you are thinking or feeling, doing or imagining.

The stable door is open: no religious tickets or church loyalty cards needed. The child in the manger calls to all people, through time and space, to let go of Christmas business, to be still, to gaze, to rest in the presence of love. He reaches out a tiny, vulnerable hand, and beckons to us to cross the bridges of story and space, and to join the circle in the stable; a family circle where we are known and loved, where we can laugh and play, and where, as we re-discover the child within, the Kingdom of Heaven opens up around us.

May the blessings of the Christ child be with you and your household this Christmas.

WHAT DOES A PCC DO?

In recent years there have been very successful teas in Fewston Parochial Hall which will be replaced with teas in the new Heritage Centre during 2011. Fewston and Blubberhouses PCC has come in for a great deal of criticism recently, which has caused upset to members. Sadly, some of the comments have been strongly worded and have disturbed the PCC. We would like to point out that this is a body which represents the people. We are an elected body and entirely voluntary. We would also like to point out that we are responsible for the running of the church buildings and the parochial hall - three buildings requiring a good deal of voluntary assistance and voluntary giving. These buildings are for the people to use as and when they have a need, spiritual or social, at any time.

However

- these buildings require maintenance to keep them in a suitable state of repair and presentation for those needs.
This task falls on the PCC to arrange and administer.
- The cost of maintenance falls on the congregation in their voluntary giving, plus any fund-raising events.
This task falls on the PCC to arrange and administer.
- The baking, serving, carol singing, and all public events are all tasks which fall on the PCC to arrange and administer.
- There is a Diocesan Share which has to be paid annually and helps to pay for clergy. At around £8,000 it is not insignificant.
This task falls on the PCC to arrange and administer
- There is insurance, electrics, heating, and staffing to arrange.
This task also falls on the PCC.

The PCC is formed by people who have a great love of the churches in our valley and who are largely drawn from the congregations of those churches. Our task is also to try and enlarge the footprint of the Church in our valley. The task of administering the churches becomes increasingly difficult. Sometimes the weight of these burdens is in danger of outweighing the spiritual benefits. We felt some years ago that there was a need to widen the appeal of the church and to try and broaden the base of giving. This would then ensure that the church would continue to be maintained and thrive in an area where the population is sparse, and at a time when there is increasing secularisation of society.

In order to do this a much more dynamic approach was needed, and the idea of the Heritage Centre began to take place. From the church's point of view it is necessary to view the Centre as an additional means of providing funding to the church. The Centre will also be a fantastic place for community use not just for those who live in the Washburn Valley but from further afield, places such as Leeds, Bradford and Harrogate. Without the extra funding the future looks bleak.

We all have a right to expect the church to be available for Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals and these services have to be administered by a priest. The costs annually of maintaining and running the buildings comes from the voluntary giving, as does the Diocesan Share.

We cannot continue, the faithful few, to dig into an ever diminishing pot of funds and voluntary help in the same way that we have relied on for decades. Times are changing and, like it or not, we have to change our way of thinking in step with those external changes.

THE WASHBURN HERITAGE CENTRE

As with so many building projects, ours has encountered some unexpected delays. The original date for completion was in October, but now it is to be at the beginning of December. However, those of us who have donned hard hats and been inside are very pleased with the way the building is taking shape. It really will provide a wonderful venue for all the events which will form the centre's programme as well as for visiting groups who book it for their use. Those who have walked round Swinsty Reservoir recently will have seen that Yorkshire Water have now put in the promised new path from the reservoir to the churchyard. Once the building work is finished a lot more things will happen.

The centre will need to be equipped, and the interior of the church prepared for the permanent exhibitions which are to be installed in January. This will involve moving the shields from the north wall to the south wall and redecorating the nave. The PCC has agreed that the chancel is also to be decorated at the same time. We also hope to provide a new lighting scheme for the church, which will enhance its beauty as well as providing appropriate lighting for performances.

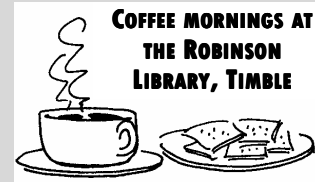
The gravemarkers which had to be moved to make way for the building will need to be re-erected in the area near the north gate of the churchyard during the winter, and the remains re-interred at a later date once the research on them is complete.

Due to the delay on the building, our plans for the launch of the centre and the Washburn Society have also slipped. The Washburn Society, which will run the Centre's programme of events, will be launched in January – watch this space! The centre will host open days for invited guests and other visitors each Sunday in February, which will be widely advertised. We hope that as many people as possible will take the opportunity to visit the centre and see what it has to offer. Then, in March, the full programme of events will start and the tea room will open for the first time on Sunday 6th March.

We were very pleased to appoint Andrea and Matthew Walwyn to operate the tea room at the centre. They live in Birstwith where they run the village shop, and as AJs they run the bistro at the Academy health club in Harrogate. They are very supportive of the aims of the centre and are committed to sourcing their supplies as locally as possible. The income from the letting of the tea room is vital to the financial viability of the centre which, once established, should contribute to the maintenance of the church.

In preparation for the opening a great deal of work continues on all aspects of the programme, as Sally described last month. In particular, the Heritage Wardens have had their first training session – a very interesting and well structured evening. The role promises to be great fun, providing lots of opportunities to meet people and enjoy social events. With the numbers of volunteers we have now, we expect the time commitment for each person to be about 3 hours per month – but this would reduce if we had more volunteers. Please do get in touch if you think you might be interested in getting involved with this really exciting venture.

A Meeting of the Washburn Parish Council was held at The Robinson Library, Timble, on 1st November attended by all Parish Councillors and C. Cllr. John Fort.

WASHBURN PARISH COUNCIL

The safe-keeping of Parish Records was discussed and C. Cllr. Fort has kindly arranged for the Minute Books, dating back to 1963, and other important Parish documents, to be lodged at North Yorkshire County Council Records Department in the County Hall at Northallerton. They will be accessible to the public if desired.

Cllr. Grange and Brian Porter had inspected all the items set up by the Mid-Washburn Valley Millennium Committee (oak trees, viewfinder, interpretation boards etc) and discovered that some maintenance was needed. The Council agreed unanimously that it was prepared to take over the ownership and responsibility for these items.

The Clerk was asked to look into the cost of grass cutting around the Parish on the minor roads. Looking towards winter, a discussion took place on ensuring that sufficient grit was available and accessible when needed.

Again, many Highways issues were raised, varying from potholes at various sites and water on patches of road to restricted vision at spots accessing the A59. The Councillors were constantly vigilant in working towards safety on the roads within the Parish.

There was good news for Fewston Parochial Hall, which will be receiving some commuted sums allowable in connection with a development at Corner Farm, Norwood. It was further planned to spend another commuted sum allowance on tidying Jack Hill Lane verges.

After the Meeting, a discussion took place on the occupancy of Washburn Cottages, Fewston. The Councillors wondered if it was generally known that interested parties needed to register with Harrogate Council Housing Department. They are two-bedroomed properties and come under the 'affordable housing scheme'. Cllr. Grange mentioned that there were also properties at Askwith and Copmanroyd, Clifton.

The next Meeting of the Parish Council will be held at Norwood Social Hall, on January 10th 2011, at 7.30 pm.
