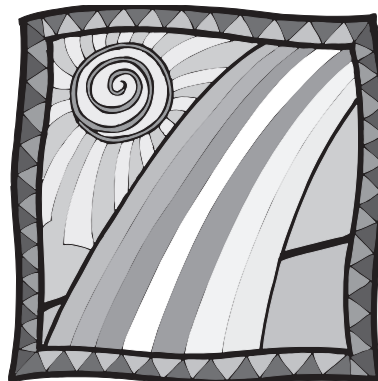

## HAPPY EASTER EVERYONE

The spirit of Easter is central to our Christian faith. It is summed up neatly in the question of a child: "How does Jesus make us real? .... Does he draw us first and then colour us in?" What a lovely description of resurrection life, first Jesus draws us, draws us to him, recreating and refiguring us in his image. Then he begins to colour us in, through our developing faith and our choosing to live life in his way. As we continue to become more and more Christ-like, he continues to shape us and colour us in his image, not for ourselves, but so that we become life-givers, life-makers, bearing the resurrection with us wherever we go.

This week at a meeting I heard part of a story of someone's own experience of Christ - she said he looked at her with love and his eyes were all the colours of the rainbow. What a beautiful image! It was the rainbow that God gave as a sign of his covenant with Noah, and I find that rainbows come at significant times for me, when I need encouragement or affirmation.



Resurrection is one of those words we realise we don't fully understand as we get older - not merely a concept with which we simply agree or disagree on an intellectual level, but something that deeply affects who we are. Resurrection is more than rising from the dead, it points to a new way of looking at the world, a new way of being that changes who we are and how we live in it. It colours our lives until we are totally infused with the things of the Spirit.

We can live the resurrection life in this world, if we allow Jesus to redraw us and colour us in with love.

May the risen Christ fill you with his love and life.

## NEWS FROM FARNLEY

Sarah and Peter Ashby and family have all been busy clearing out the weeds in the flower and heather beds on the south facing bank of the churchyard.

The weeds had taken such a hold that it was necessary to lift all the plants, put them in pots for last year, and spray off the weeds, leaving the soil for a few months before digging over with manure, leaving it again to settle and then starting the replanting stages. You can now see the shape of things to come. There will be more plants to add and if anyone would like to give a contribution please ring Sarah on 01943 462726.

The bulbs which were planted under the wall outside the car park have also flowered this year and the narcissus around the cherry tree and in the entrance to the church yard are now spreading and providing a lovely splash of spring colour.

We hosted a brush-cutter trimmer course at Farnley Church recently and were joined by staff from Ripley Castle Gardens, National Trust, Brimham Rocks and Nostell Priory. Mowing around the gravestones and trees was ideal for their technical assessment! We would like to thank them for their tidy work during their training course.

## BE AN ORGAN DONOR!

No – we are not after your body parts! Fewston Church is embarking on a project to re-furbish the church organ which is sadly showing signs of extensive wear and tear.

Little is known of the early history of the instrument but local research has shown that it existed prior to 1885 when its “unsightly parts” were covered, and in 1905 the local paper reported it as “discordant and well nigh unplayable due to damp.”

Apart from some minor repairs and annual tuning, little has been done to the instrument since those days.

The project, planned by church organist Martin Gott, Treasurer Phil Bland (himself an organist) and advised by Chris Denton, will see a new blower motor installed, the bellows restored and the instrument dismantled and fully cleaned. If funds allow the decorative front pipework will be cleaned and restored too.



All of this will cost nearly £8,000. Various fundraising events are planned throughout the year – watch this space for news – and we hope the work will be completed by the end of 2011.

## WASHBURN SOCIETY

The Washburn Society has been formed to deliver the programme of the Washburn Heritage Centre. Over 120 members have joined so far and we hope for many more. Please see the website [www.washburnvalley.org](http://www.washburnvalley.org) from which you can print off an membership application form.

The inaugural meeting in March was attended by 31 members who elected our first committee. The Chair is Sally Robinson. Architect Stephen Calvert then made a presentation about the design and building of the Centre.

Over two thousand people have visited the Centre already and been able to see the first exhibition, 'Ways & Waymarkers'. The current exhibition is 'The Valley before and after the Reservoirs', featuring a unique 15 foot long map and other maps dating from 1851.

There are many favourable remarks from visitors in the comments book, and architects and representatives of other community projects have been enthusiastic in their praise of the Centre. At least two Heritage Wardens have been on duty during the Centre opening hours.

Despite it being held on a foggy day, people heard plenty of birdsong during a walk, talk and lunch with knowledgeable birder Peter Riley from Wharfedale Naturalists. Spring was celebrated at the Lambing Live events with Chris and Christine Ryder at their farm at Blubberhouses, enabling many adults and children to enjoy the delights of lambing, including live births, feeding orphan lambs and chasing piglets. On the same theme a concert of choral music, 'Feed My Sheep', presented by Chris Denton with the help of three choirs and his angel-voiced wife, Camilla Campling-Denton at Fewston Church delighted the audience with their music for Passiontide and Easter.

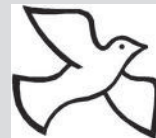

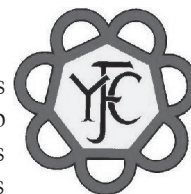
