## WHOSE RULES?

Last month we were all shocked as pictures of riots in our cities were broadcast around the world. It is so long since we had that scale of rioting in this country that for many younger people this was something totally outside of their experience. The causes are complex and glib responses do little to contribute.

What has been the church's role? There are many churches which gallantly carry on work week in and week out with children and young people in tough situations and they deserve our support. But what has the church had to say? Have we been far too quiet as secularisation has crept into our society? Secular society says that we are all free to choose our own moral guidelines and we are free to teach our children from those guidelines that we select.

The voice of faith replies that we have been given the very best principles by the Son of God himself. Jesus taught that we should love God with heart, mind, soul and strength and love our neighbour as ourselves. This is a summary of the Ten Commandments (which can be found in the book of Exodus in the bible and displayed on some of our church walls). The Christian believer is not free to choose their own guidelines – only free to interpret what we have been given to the best of their ability.

However either the full commandments – which tend to start 'You shall not...' and the summary of the law given by Jesus are only part of the story. They were not given by a spoil-sport God. They were given to be a framework within which life is to be enjoyed. Many of the stories told by Jesus – the Prodigal Son, the lost sheep, the lost coin for example – speak of joy and celebration in heaven when a man, woman or child realises that they have been wrong and admits it. Jesus knew how to party and was famous for keeping the wrong sort of company.

Ancient as both the Ten Commandments and the summary given by Jesus are, they are still relevant. We live in a very acquisitive society – if we took seriously not envying the belongings of others (the tenth commandment) but rather enjoying what we have, things might look rather different.

I hope that the church can play its full part in dealing with the aftermath of the riots. I also hope that it can lead the way in speaking out about the way we live, and show that it knows how to party when there is something to celebrate.

## ROLAND COATES - AN APPRECIATION FROM FEWSTON BELLRINGERS

The death of Roland has come as a tragic and unexpected shock, particularly to our bellringing team. It is perhaps appropriate in a perverse sort of way that he should die very suddenly whilst ringing for an Otley wedding; in fact doing one of the things he so much enjoyed.

Roland, of Norwood, became involved in bellringing in 2001, shortly after the Fewston bells had been brought back into use after many years of dereliction. The PCC decided to support the formation of a bellringing team and Pat Anderson, Kath Dinsdale, Jean Petty, Roland and I all wanted to ring but none of us had the necessary expertise.

For several years we travelled up to Pateley Bridge one evening per week to receive half an hour's tuition from Chris Robson of the Upper Nidderdale Bellringers before listening to their more experienced ringers for a further one and a half hours.

Gradually we began to ring our own bells at Fewston, and sometimes at Leathley, and it quickly became apparent that Roland had that extra skill and dedication that was to give him so much fulfilment in the field. Not only did he ring at Fewston and Pateley Bridge, but very soon he was ringing at dozens of other towers in the North of England and further afield.

His practical skills were also most useful for bell maintenance activities and in the early days he and I spent many hours re-fitting bearings, splicing ropes, adjusting and stabilising our old belfry oak frame etc. etc.

In more recent times Roland rang less at Fewston and more at other towers where more advanced 'methods' are the order of the day. However if we were shorthanded or needed particular advice or help he was always available and understanding.

All of our now enlarged team offer Dorothy and the family our deepest sympathy and feel privileged that we have been associated with such a likeable, competent, willing and inspiring colleague.

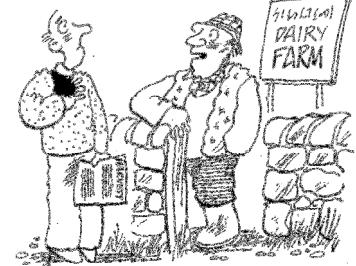

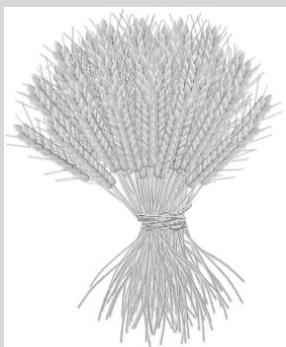

## BEAN CAKE

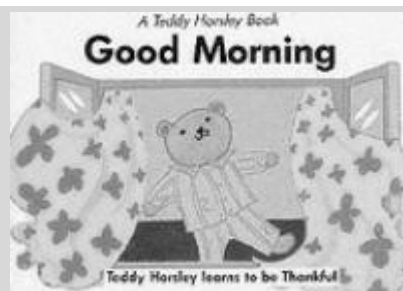

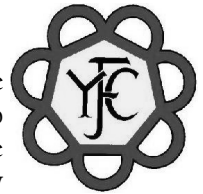
