CONSIDERING GOD'S LOVE

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

This is perhaps the most famous piece of literature ever written. It is certainly one of the most widely known pieces of Scripture. And it is appropriate to dwell on it for a moment as we prepare to mark St. Valentine's Day because it is all about love.

But here's the thing about this passage. Many people don't have much of a problem thinking that God loves the world, yet they do have a problem accepting that God loves them as an individual. So, do you believe that God loves YOU?

It seems to me that we often live with the assumption that God's love for us is conditional on our behaviour. It is as if God were sitting on a swivel chair, looking at us and smiling when we keep our hands, minds and hearts pure but then the moment we do something wrong God turns his back on us.

Of course, we are used to living with this concept because our whole world runs on the basis of performance or achievement. We cannot escape it and in the end our self-esteem – our sense of acceptance, value and worth become dependent upon our ability to perform and achieve.

And because this is so much a part of the way we experience the world, it is only natural that we project this same understanding onto God and we end up thinking, *"What can we do to get God to approve of, accept and love us?"* The world tells us that the answer to that is the quality of our religious performance. But that quote from John 3: 16 & 17 tells us something different. It tells us that God loves the world. Not just a few, but the world, and as we know the world is full of broken, weak, hurting people.

The truth is that God's love for each and every one of us is unconditional. God cannot love us and more or less than He already does. For sure, he does not like the way we often live but he loves us none the less. Unlike many of our human 'loves' he will not forget us, abandon us or betray us. Indeed, Jesus once said, *"I will never leave you nor forsake you."* And my experience is that he never has done.

So perhaps it is not God who sits in the swivel chair after all. Perhaps it is you and I!

St Valentine's Day 14th February

Many believe St Valentine was named after one or more Christian martyrs and was established by Pope Gelasius 1 in 496 AD. Valentine of Rome was martyred about 269, and this day usually 'belongs' to him.

The first recorded association of Valentine Day with romantic love (1382) is from Geoffrey Chaucer. He wrote, 'For this was Saint Valentine's Day, when every bird cometh there to choose his mate.' This poem was in honour of the first anniversary of the engagement

of King Richard II of England to Anne of Bohemia. Valentine Day is referred to by Ophelia in Hamlet (1600-1601).

The January meeting of the Council was held at Norwood Social Hall. The Chairman welcomed a member of the public and also Mr Andrew Campbell, who had expressed an interest in the vacancy for Timble Great.

During 'Public Participation' the issue of mountain-biking at Stainburn Forest (on the B6451 climbing up Norwood Edge) was raised. It was observed that this was a hazard to traffic and a danger to the cyclists themselves. The Clerk was asked to pursue the subject with the appropriate authority.

It was noted that maintenance work on Meagill Lane Chapel had been completed. Matters concerning the Chapel were discussed and it would appear as an Agenda item on the next Meeting of Council.

There had been a site meeting in Timble (Highways, Councillors, Public) to view the problem of water on the road by the Inn. This was a drainage problem and NYCC and HBC would decide which authority was responsible before action could be taken. A collection of Highways problems was catalogued, including many potholes across the Parish and the need for drainage on both sides of the road at the top of Norwood Edge. A request for action would be sent to NYCC.

Parish Councillors met the Secretary of the Parochial Church Council at Fewston regarding the Council's lighting initiative to mark the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. The PCC would obtain three quotes for the work before the Parish Council's March Meeting.

'County and Borough Matters' appeared as a new, and now regular, item on the Agenda, giving County Councillor John Fort and Borough Councillor Richard Grange an opportunity to report items of interest.

The written resignation of Cllr. Ian Foster had been received by the Chairman. The Council voiced its thanks for all his efforts over many years. Mr Andrew Campbell was co-opted as the new Councillor for Timble Great, after a unanimous vote.

The full Minutes of the Meeting are posted on the Washburn website (www.washburnvalley.org). These are draft Minutes and open to correction at the next meeting of the Council, which will be at The Robinson Library, Timble on the 5th March at 7.30pm.
