Easter

is a time for making a joyful noise, with rousing hymns and anthems, bells ringing forth, and cheerful shouts of 'Alleluia'. During my training I remember a particularly noisy Easter celebration. I was on placement at St Agnes Church, Longsight, Manchester, where the Easter Vigil service is timed to finish at midnight. Suddenly the church was lit up with colour, laughter and excited chatter as everyone in the largely Afro-Caribbean congregation let off party poppers. Three years later, when a Curate in Fountains, I had my first experience of Easter beginning with a bang as we gathered outside the Chapel of the Resurrection on Dallowgill Moor, to begin our Easter Rising service with the launch of a rocket.

Fireworks and party poppers might not make an appearance in formal service books but they do get the point across that the good news of the Resurrection is something to celebrate with great noise and gusto. In the words of Jean Tisserand's fifteenth century hymn:

*On this most holy day of days
to God your hearts and voices raise,
in laud and jubilee and praise.
Alleluia!*



While we may not always be in the mood for making such a rousing noise every morning the song of Easter continues to echo through every day of the year. Easter can be heard singing as each night turns to day, and as, in whatever little way, darkness is turned to light, sorrow to joy, doubt to faith, loneliness to companionship, hostility to acceptance, anxiety to peace.

Day by day we are invited to join in the joyful noise of Easter. New Life soars above the sound of song birds when we wake up with eyes that see beauty around us, with ears that hear melody, and lips that speak harmony. New life chimes out across the valley when we forgive or are forgiven, when we learn a new skill, see things differently, or teach something precious. New life laughs and cheers when we open our doors to a stranger or find that we are accepted. New life sounds the trumpet and gently strums the harp when love and generosity overflow. New life beats the drum when the blood runs through our veins with excitement and ideas and we take risks and allow ourselves to be changed, and when in the stillness of our heart we feel, we know, that there Jesus lives.

GIVING LIFE

Maybe you are reading this in Holy Week, with Good Friday as its climax. Maybe it's Easter.

By his supreme sacrifice of himself, Jesus 'cracked it' - we celebrate that forgiveness and new life from God are freely open to us. God is moving on: with us, not away from us.

Christian Aid Week this year falls towards the end of Eastertide and includes Ascension Day. Christian Aid, and the Week which is its major fund-raiser are, I believe, part of the fight to set free captives of sorrow and sin in a practical way.

The Gospel of Jesus is Good News, but Christian Aid and its partners across the world don't preach it. Their Good News is relief in time of disaster. More, it is giving a leg up to some of the world's poorest people so that they - and their community - can have a better life. Christian Aid's basic slogan is, "We believe in life before death". That is, life for anyone and any community of any faith or none. Christian Aid's partner organisations stand alongside them where they are and help them to organise. For example, I wrote last month about new, life-transforming facilities for the people of a Kenya slum.

Christian Aid and partners are 'can do' people. Please be ready to support them in the red envelopes of Christian Aid Week, 9th-15th May. As always, I'm looking for more volunteer collectors to go house-to-house in a limited area. Please let me know if you can help.

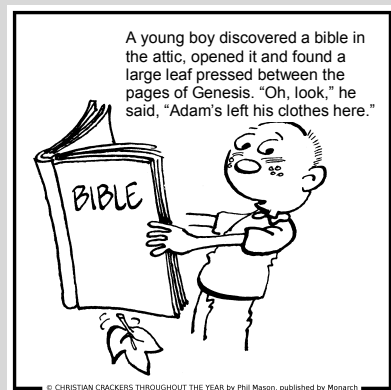

FEWSTON CHURCH BELL APPEAL FUND

“THE FINAL PULL”

The restoration and augmentation of Fewston Bells is now approaching completion. This has been a two stage process:

Stage 1 Strengthening of the bellhanging frame and installation of 2 additional bells to the original 4, increasing the peal to 6. This took place in January 2009, cost £12,900 and has been fully paid for.

Stage 2 Refitting the 4 original bells with state-of-the-art headstocks wheels, bearings and pulleys etc as well as having all the bells finely harmonised by a specialist firm. This will cost £12,300 and is scheduled for completion before the end of 2010. At the present time we have secured £4,300 leaving a shortfall of £8,000.



Can you help?

A successful brass band concert has recently raised over £700 and over this summer other fund raising activities and grant applications are planned. In addition it is hoped that further donors will come forward. Some people may wish to contribute in memory of loved ones or to commemorate a wedding or baptism. Such details could be recorded for substantial donors on a permanent plaque which it is envisaged being installed at the back of the church beneath the tower.

Please help to complete this worthwhile and long overdue project – the bells at Fewston were derelict and unfit for ringing for approximately 40 years prior to 2000.

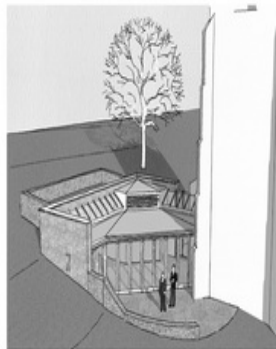

THE WASHBURN HERITAGE PROJECT

After nearly five years of hard work by many people and the support of many more, the Washburn Heritage Centre at Fewston Church is now becoming a reality. Following a successful meeting with our Heritage Lottery Fund Case Officer on 2nd March, the contract with the builders was signed on 8th March and a pre-commencement meeting held on 9th March. Our builders are R N Wooler Ltd of Keighley, and Andrew Wooler is taking a personal interest in our scheme, which he sees as a particularly fine building.



The hearse house will be demolished (with the stone saved for re-use) and the area excavated by the archaeologist at the end of March, and the main contract will start on 12th April. The building should be complete and ready for equipping at the end of October.

A lot of work continues to prepare the programme and exhibitions for the Centre, and the design and setting up of a website has been commissioned. This will be both a community website and act as an archive for the oral history material that is being gathered. The series of WEA workshops continue and have proved very popular, with most being full or even over-subscribed.

We hope that as many of you as possible will enjoy our St George's Night Celebration on 23rd April.

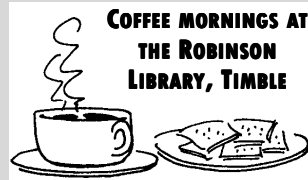

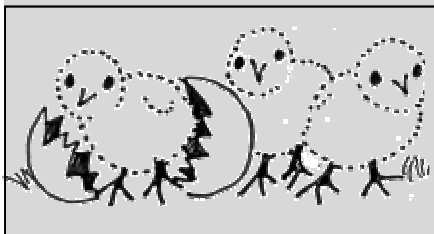

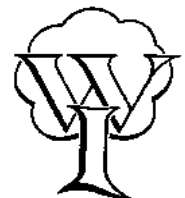

EASTER FLOWERS

From the darkness of Good Friday, the day on which Jesus died on the cross, we come to the light and joy of Easter Day.

In Lent the church was dull and bare but at Easter it is bright with masses of flowers. The flowers remind us that the world is full of life, even though it looked so dead through the winter months.



You can read what happened in a special garden on that very first Easter Day in the Gospels; Matthew, chapter 28; Mark, chapter 16; Luke, chapter 24 and John, chapter 20.



What flower does everyone have?
Tulips.

YOUR OWN EASTER GARDEN

Lots of churches build an Easter garden to show the empty tomb. You can make your own quite simply – you will need a shallow tin or dish, soil or potting compost, moss, stones, empty little jar (from baby food or paste), flowers and leaves and a small clay flower pot.



Line the dish with soil or potting compost and put the clay flowerpot on its side to make the tomb. Cover the sides of the pot and the soil with moss.

Make a hole in the 'grass' large enough to take the jar. Fill the jar with water and a small arrangement of flowers and leaves.



Decorate the garden with stones (for a path), pebbles and other flowers. Put one large stone by the side of the mouth of the flower pot to make the door of the tomb that was rolled away. Spray your garden with water and it will keep green and fresh for quite a long time.

What is Maundy Thursday?

Maundy Thursday is famous for two things. The first is one of the final acts that Jesus did before his death: the washing of his own disciples' feet. (see John 13) Jesus washed his disciples' feet for a purpose:

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." The word 'mundy' is a corruption of the Latin 'mandatum' (or command).

But Thursday was also important because it was on that night that Jesus first introduced the Lord's Supper, or what we nowadays call Holy Communion. Jesus and his close friends had met in a secret upper room to share the Passover meal together - for the last time. And there Jesus transformed the Passover into the Lord's Supper, saying, 'this is my body' and



'this is my blood' as he, the Lamb of God, prepared to die for the sins of the whole world.

Good Friday

Good Friday is the day on which Jesus died on the cross. It is the most solemn day in the Christian year. Buns decorated with a cross are eaten—hot cross buns.

Easter Day

Easter, of course, is the most special day of the Christian year: the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Finally, why Easter eggs? On one hand, they are an ancient symbol of birth in most European cultures. On the other hand, hens start laying regularly again each Spring. Since eggs were forbidden during Lent, it's easy to see how decorating and eating them became a practical way to celebrate Easter.

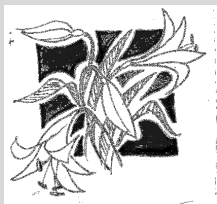

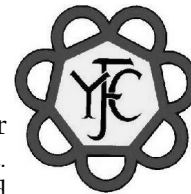
