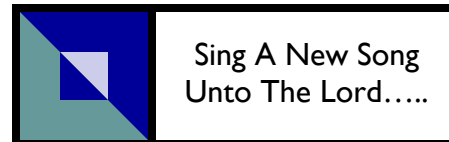

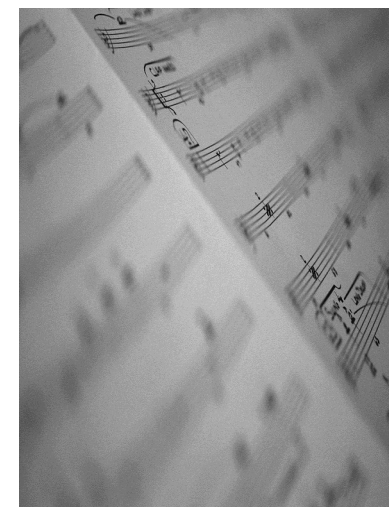

## Planning Your Wedding Music



The Planning of music is an integral part of your Wedding Ceremony or Nuptial Mass. To help you in planning the music for your wedding,

the following list is a step by step process:

- (1) Look through the list of musical possibilities offered in the brochure. Please note that these are NOT the only pieces to choose from. If you have other selections in mind, please list them on your notes section of the brochure and we will discuss them at our meeting.
- (2) Make an appointment to meet with me and discuss ideas, other music, soloists or instrumentalists you may want to include. You can make an appointment by calling or e-mail the music office.
- (3) You will receive a finalized list of music chosen and placed in the wedding liturgy at our meeting along with a wedding fee envelope. The fee should be handed in the night of the rehearsal.

### Processionals:

Two selections are chosen here— one to accompany bridal party and one for the bride. **Note:** if small bridal party one piece may be used for everyone.
