Notes from the Pastor...

Through the month of February, the Sunday morning sermons will be focused on the Gospel of Matthew and Jesus' call to discipleship. This past year, while we developed our Mission Study and our new mission statement, the congregation chose a scripture from Matthew to describe what it is into which we seek to live.

"You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

Disciples of Jesus Christ seek to be God's light to the world. We do not hide our gifts, our talents, or our treasures, but rather we use them for God's glory so that others will see God's love in this world.

In the book, Power Surge, Michael Foss gives six marks of what it means to be Disciples in today's church. As he develops these six marks he states: Disciples are not just members of the church, but they are active members involved in the various ministries of the congregation. Disciples seek to grow in their spiritual leadership, they are involved in Bible Study, worship, and prayer. Disciples are involved in the life of

the church through hospitality and care for one another.

His six marks are:

1. Daily Prayer (join the church e-mail prayer chain and pray for each other daily)
2. Weekly worship (can't make it on Sunday, join us Wed. night)
3. Bible Reading (various Bible Study groups meet throughout the week)
4. Service (join the missions ministry – they can use you!)
5. Spiritual Friendship (join a small group, join the nurture ministry)

Giving (time, talent, treasure – every ministry can use you in same way, shape, or fashion)

Congregations that seek time and energy in growing themselves into Disciples experience what Michael Foss calls – a Power Surge. The Holy Spirit is alive within the church and the energy becomes contagious. Find time through the month of February to read through the Gospel of Matthew. Listen to Jesus' call to "Come and Follow." Is there something within the life of the church that you are passionate about and would like to learn how to become more involved? Now is the time. Together, let us continue to build a vibrant and loving community of faith here in this place.

Souper Bowl of Caring—Help Feed the Hungry on Feb. 6

Learn about hunger statistics in America.

We all know that many more people TODAY are suffering the effects of the current economy.

- In 2009, 43.6 million people (14.3 percent) were in poverty.
- In 2009, 8.8 million (11.1 percent) of families were in poverty.
- In 2009, 24.7 million (12.9 percent) of people aged 18-64 were in poverty.
- In 2009, 15.5 million (20.7 percent) children under the age of 18 were in poverty.
- **In 2009, 3.4 million (8.9 percent) seniors 65 and older were in poverty.**

Hunger Statistics on Food Insecurity and Very Low Food Security

- In 2009, 50.2 million Americans lived in food insecure households, 33 million adults and 17.2 million children
- In 2009, 14.7 percent of households (17.4 million households) were food insecure.
- In 2009, 5.7 percent of households (6.8 million households) experienced very low food security.
- In 2009, households with children reported food insecurity at almost double the rate for those without children, 21.3 percent compared to 11.4 percent.
- In 2009, households that had higher rates of food insecurity than the national average included households with children (21.3 per-

cent), especially households with children headed by single women (36.6 percent) or single men (27.8 percent), Black non-Hispanic households (24.9 percent) and Hispanic households (26.9 percent).

- **In 2009, 7.8 percent of seniors living alone (884,000 households) were food insecure.**



On February 6

What is Per Capita?

The PER CAPITA apportionment is a PER MEMBER charge that we pay annually to Newton Presbytery.

It represents our church's share of the administrative costs for Newton Presbytery, the Synod of the Northeast and the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA).

The Per Capita for 2011 is \$30 per member. It does not include children who have not yet joined the church (typically younger than 8th grade). That means if there are three church members in a family, the Per Capita amount would be \$90.00.

By paying your Per Capita amount, you enable this church to use all of your pledge monies for operating expenses, church programs and mission commitments. The total amount owed to Newton Presbytery for 2011 is \$16,710 (\$30 x 581 members).

Special Per Capita ENVELOPES are located in your box of offering envelopes.

You will also find special BLUE Per Capita envelopes in the pews.

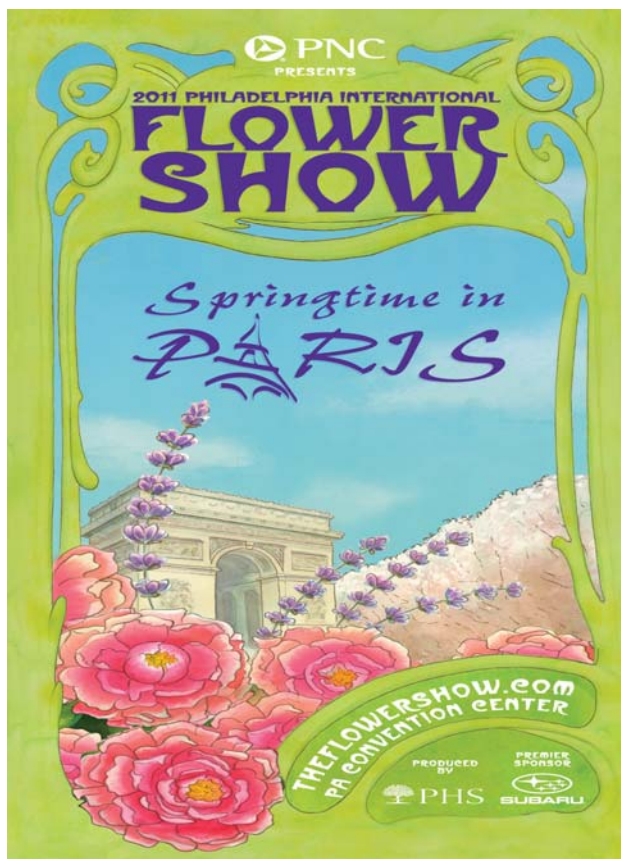
