PC(USA) General Assembly is meeting soon.

The 219th General Assembly (2010) will meet July 3 – 10, at the Minneapolis Convention Center. Some 1500 volunteers from the Presbyteries of the Twin Cities Area, Minnesota Valleys, and Northern Waters will help host the assembly.

The theme for this year's assembly is

Rivers of Living Water, taken from John 7:38: ... and let the one who believes in me drink.

As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water'

The Stated Clerk of the General Assembly has released his greatest hopes for the 219th General Assembly (2010) of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), to be held in Minneapolis from July 3-10, 2010.

Prayerful decision-making The spirit in which decisions are made at the assembly will be a prayerful and careful witness of decision-making for the entire church.

Deeper awareness of the whole PC (USA) Commissioners and advisory delegates will gain a deeper awareness of the length and breadth of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), realizing they are part of something much larger than themselves.

Issues facing congregations Commissioners and advisory delegates will discern with the whole church the issues and challenges facing congregations

Common calling to a changing church A clear, common calling will emerge to actively and hopefully engage with the reality of a church in change.

Attention beyond ourselves Attention will move beyond ourselves to a world in great need, committing ourselves to gospel work: making disciples, feeding the hungry, welcoming the outcast, encouraging the fainthearted, working for peace – all in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Enthusiastic sharing of the faith Those who are part of the assembly will be the first in line of Presbyterians to talk about their faith with a contagious enthusiasm.

Furthering the mission of Christ At the end of the assembly, commissioners and advisory delegates will have a deep sense that what they did will further the mission of Christ in the world.

Communication is Key

Each year, the Newton Presbytery sponsors a program to encourage congregations to try something new to extend their outreach and impact in the community. The program awards a "New Thing" grant equal to the calendar year (this year, in the amount of \$2,010) to help fund those efforts.

With the creation of a "Communications Ministry" and many new activities under that umbrella, The Presbyterian Church of Morris Plains applied for a "New Thing" grant this year. We were pleased to receive word from the Presbytery's Development & Redevelopment Committee that our application was approved! **Our church will be receiving \$2,010**, which will offset the costs of a number of upcoming projects.

As you know, we are creating brochures about the different ministries, and that collection will continue to grow throughout the year. Not only are we sharing them during worship, but we hope you share them with people outside the walls of our church to encourage them to come visit us and perhaps get involved. In the near future, you will be able to get copies of these brochures from a handsome literature rack which will be mounted outside the church office - thanks to our "New Thing" grant. The grant also

is subsidizing the cost of printer ink so we can keep the materials coming!

We also are taking on the ambitious plan of producing a **church "video"** in the coming months. This effort will leverage video "featurettes" already produced, and be an attractive online recruiting tool as we seek our new pastor. We hope to continue stretching those grant dollars so we can provide a physical copy of the DVD to members of the congregation toward the end of the year. Stay tuned for more!

The Communications Ministry also wants to publicly and **sincerely thank** the Walsh Memorial Bell Choir Program for their generous donation to our 2010 efforts. Their gift, will be used in collaboration with the Facilities Ministry to purchase and install a display monitor near the entrance by the office.

In the coming months, many of the announcements and multi-media materials otherwise shared on a limited basis during worship services will be able to reach everyone who enters our doors. Thank you again to everyone who supported the Walsh Memorial Bell Choir this year, and to each ringer in the program for their contribution to these Communications efforts.

One particular comment made by the Development & Redevelopment Committee seems a fitting closing. **"Pastors like**

to jump onto moving trains and not those that are stalled in the station," concluded the committee chair in their letter to our Communications Ministry. **"It is very easy to lose momentum. So our advice is, don't wait, keep chugging along trusting that the Lord will steer you in the direction of someone who likes where you are headed and feels called to climb aboard."**

Flowers, Prayer & Compassion

You probably know that you can sign up to donate flowers for the chancel but do you know what happens to those flowers each Sunday? They soak in the praises and prayers that are shared during worship, and absorb the music that fills the sanctuary. Then, the flowers are delivered to members of our congregation who couldn't be there in person, or who are especially in need of blessings in times of joy or pain. If you can spare an hour once in a while on Sunday mornings, you could help us bring flowers - and our compassion - to someone. We can use your help, even if just once this year. BECOMING DISCIPLES
THROUGH BIBLE STUDY

BECOMING DISCIPLES THROUGH BIBLE STUDY is the foundation of the DISCIPLE Bible Study program.

DISCIPLE assumes that the bible is the key to renewal in the church. It recognizes the human-divine nature of the Bible: The actual texts of Scripture were written by human beings like ourselves in their cultural settings, under the divine inspiration of God.

DISCIPLE affirms that the canon was formed as it is in order for God to speak to us. BECOMING DISCIPLES THROUGH BIBLE STUDY gives equal time to both the Old and New Testament, emphasizing the wholeness of the Bible as the revelation of God. DISCIPLE aims at transformation, not just information, and calls on persons to submit themselves to examination by Scripture, to put themselves under the power of God's Word, and to be changed by God's Word. DISCIPLE invites persons to bring their experiences and struggles to the Scripture. All persons know something is amiss with their existence and yearn for the Word from God.

BECOMING DISCIPLES THROUGH BIBLE STUDY uses biblical language and images and draws upon the work of scholars to aid understanding of the Bible.

This study requires reading large portions of Scripture each week and is based on careful study and preparation. During the course of thirty-four weeks, groups will move through the biblical stories of Creation to the New Jerusalem. The titles of the sessions along with theme words; theme verses; and major persons, events, and topics will set the sequence of the biblical story in the minds of the participants. The principal Scripture for each session follows the chronological movement of the biblical story.
