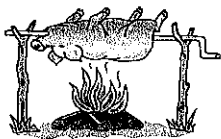

While Mike and Tami are on vacation during the second half of July, we will have the pleasure of hearing three excellent guest speakers in Sunday Worship:

--On Sunday, July 17, be sure to present as MARK CROTHERS will bring the morning's sermon. Many of you have known Mark through the years. He currently is the Church Administrator at our sister congregation, First Congregational UCC in Boise. Mark has assumed many leadership positions at First Church over the years, including Moderator of the Congregation, Chair of the Deacons, member of their Missions Board, and Chair of the Conference Assembly which was held at their church in 2010. In addition, he has filled the pulpit at many of our South Idaho UCC churches through the years.

Mark is a graduate of the University of Idaho, and he studied for two years at Western Theological Seminary in Holland, Michigan. He also has been a volunteer in several political campaigns and brings a deep sense of welcome and justice to all he is and does. Welcome, Mark! Our own Carl Van Slyke will be the Worship Leader that morning.

--On July 24, we will have the pleasure of hearing DR. DOUGLAS LOBB from our pulpit. A lifelong and retired Congregational Minister, he and his wife moved to Boise a few years ago to be close to family. A native of Canada, he served Congregational Churches and United Church of Canada congregations all over the US and Canada. Highlights of his ministry include 10 years as Senior Pastor of the huge Timothy Eaton Memorial Church in Toronto, and his subsequent service as Executive Secretary of the Congregational Christian Churches of the USA.

Doug is a graduate of Aurora University in Illinois, The School of Theology in Claremont, California, and McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago, from which he received his Doctor of Ministry Degree. CHRISTMAS IN AUGUST
SUNDAY, AUGUST 21



We will continue our many-years tradition by celebrating "Christmas In August" on Sunday, August 21. As we did last year, this year's special Christmas offering will go to support the Interfaith Sanctuary.

The Interfaith Sanctuary is a homeless shelter supported by 28 religious organizations, representing at least 10 Christian denominations and several other faith traditions. The shelter provides a safe place for individuals, and is one of the few shelters that has a separate, clean, safe, and secure area exclusively for families. The Interfaith Sanctuary gives many families and individuals a safe alternative to sleeping on the street, or in jail, and thus provides a service that is, unfortunately, much needed in our community.

Compared to other cities, we do not have great numbers of homeless people in Boise, and many of us do not regularly see homeless people in our daily lives. However, it is a pervasive problem even in our city, and the Sanctuary is always at or near capacity.

As Christians, we are called to feed the hungry and shelter the homeless, and the Interfaith Sanctuary does just that, 365 days a year, and it can use all the help we can provide.

As is our tradition, Christmas In August donations can either be in the form of a money gift to the Shelter, or in the form of a needed item for their use. We will have a list of such items in our August 7th and 14th bulletins, and those can be placed under the Christmas in August tree during the service on the 21st. We will also send the list out to the membership via e-mail.

WHAT: **It varies.** There will be Association business meetings, guest speakers, food and fellowship, worship and vespers, and quiet time in a beautiful setting.

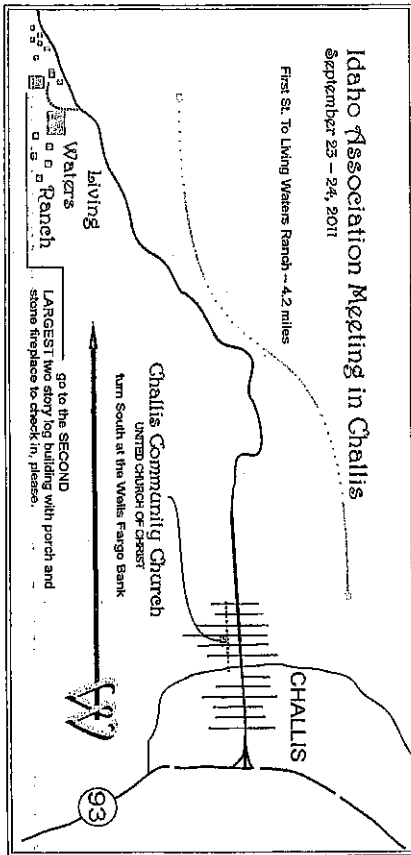
WHY: **We've got business to attend to**, friends to see, friends to meet, things to do and places to visit.

FOOD As planned, our dinner, breakfast, and box lunch plus snacks is \$20.00 – if you register before July 1st, 2011.

HOUSING **There's something for everyone.**

- a You may sleep among the aspens by the creek in your tent, non-palacial camper, or trailer with or without hook-ups Friday night – two people for \$12 to \$18 - \$5 for each additional person.
- b or bunk in the two room bunkhouse above the dining hall, bring your sleeping bag, pillow and towel - \$14 / person / night.
- c Don't feel like roughing it? How about a plush chalet:
 - 1 bedroom, one or two people - \$110 a night
 - 2 or 3 bedroom,
 - three people - \$45 each / night
 - four or more people - \$40 each / night.
- d Or there are motel rooms with two twin beds for \$48 per room per night.
- e But wait, we're not done. There's the Ranch House – sleeps 8, three bedrooms, two baths, 1 loft. Bring the whole church council. Minimum 6 people - \$42 / person / night
